Best 'in neighbourhood' one-stop shop





The proposed new Sainsbury's store has been specifically designed to deliver the best possible offer for Yatton. The vision for our store is to be the best 'in neighbourhood' one-stop-offer, with product choice and community at its heart.

The new 9,000 sq. ft. Yatton store would be focussed on providing a wide selection from Sainsbury's latest range of fresh food, highquality produce, as well as a meat-free and plant-based range alongside a broader range of scratch cooking ingredients, completing a bespoke grocery offer.

It would also feature an in-store bakery, serving freshly baked bread and pastries every day, an in-store juicer and self-service coffee machine.

An in-store Argos Click & Collect service would help to bring together the much-loved brands of Sainsbury's, Argos, Habitat and Tu Clothing under one roof, enabling customers to collect their Argos purchases whilst picking up their groceries.

The store would be situated in the 'North End', on Arnold's Way, only 1.5 km from Yatton Village Centre, providing convenient access for local residents by public transport, foot, bike



Yatton's North End area has experienced significant growth in recent years with new housing being delivered on Chestnut Place and Eaton Park, as well as further housing to the east in Horsecastle. There are currently no supermarkets in this area and our new store would be well placed to serve current and future residents.

The site is currently occupied by two large industrial-style buildings and is operated by Michael Burdge Ltd for the sale and maintenance of tractors and agricultural machinery. Michael Burdge Ltd is looking to grow and will be relocating within the area to create further job opportunities for the local community. Furthermore, it would enable residents of Yatton to meet their weekly shopping needs in the local area, thereby reducing the time people spend, and distance they travel outside of the village, to complete their main food shop.


A new Sainsbury's store would offer significant benefits for the local community as outlined opposite.

Investing in Vatton

Serving, supporting and investing

Sainsbury's is committed to serving, supporting and investing in the local community.

The store would directly support local business and retailers by enabling people to complete their shopping in Yatton, rather than travelling further afield to Clevedon or other neighbouring towns.

A new 9,000 sq. ft. Sainsbury's store represents an important investment in the area and would create new jobs for the local community.

Around 40 jobs would be created in-store, as well as additional jobs provided through the construction phase and potential for an overall increase in local expenditure from the store colleagues.

This would help retain expenditure in Yatton which is currently being lost to other areas and benefit the local economy, as 84% of local people said they currently leave Yatton to complete their main food shop.





A store for the future



Becoming Net Zero

Sainsbury's recently strengthened its commitment to tackle the climate crisis by accelerating its target to become Net Zero in its own operations by 2035, five years earlier than its original ambition and aligned to the UN's goal to limit global warming to 1.5 degrees. We are a principle partner of the COP26 climate summit and have cut our carbon footprint by 47% in the last 17 years despite our space increasing by over 40%.

As part of the development and Sainsbury's wider strategy to become a Net Zero business, the new Yatton store would be designed to achieve a BREEAM 'Excellent' Rating and would not use any gas to meet its energy requirements.

Smart active management of energy

Sainsbury's is at the forefront of energy and carbon reduction in retail and we are now using 100% renewable electricity across our estate, significantly reducing our reliance on fossil fuels. Our proposal for Yatton uses an innovative single system to provide all the store's refrigeration, cooling and heating requirements.

To achieve this the store would include a number of sustainable elements, to make it truly fit for the future, these include:

- 100% LED lighting
- 100% renewable electricity and no natural gas
- Highly thermally efficient building materials
- All natural refrigerants (Carbon Dioxide, CO2)
- Rainwater harvesting, water saving taps and WCs
- Advanced refrigerated cabinet shelf-edge technology

This reduces our energy consumption by up to 30% whilst maintaining a high-quality environment for customers and colleagues, which is warm in winter and cool in summer, by reusing any 'heating' or 'cooling' throughout the year. We call it Refrigeration Integrated Heating and Cooling (RIHC).

Encouraging sustainable travel

The new store has been designed to encourage customers to use sustainable means of travel, whilst providing ample car A total of 70 parking spaces would be provided, and the vehicle access to the store would be via a proposed junction off

parking spaces.

The store would be well connected to existing pedestrian routes and include cycle parking. The store is located 1.5km from Yatton Village Centre and less than 5 minutes' walk from the nearest bus stop on North End Road. The walk to Yatton Village Centre takes just over 15 minutes and the walk to the train station is approximately 10 minutes.

Arnold's Way.

A comprehensive Transport Assessment will be submitted as part of the planning application which will consider any impact on the local highways network, helping to ensure we deliver the best possible scheme.
